paign, IL who flew his Albatros DVa to capture First Place. Also in Expert, John Boyko from Franklin, OH with his Pitts Special took 2nd Place followed very closely by Mike Barbee from Delaware, OH with his Raytheon Beachcraft T-34C in 3rd Place.

Bill was part of the very first Masters at Mile Square Park in Southern California. He helped judge that event then gave valuable input to the original 5 founders of the US Scale Masters; much of which we are still practicing today. Due to Bill's quiet nature, he is often overlooked for his many contributions to USSMA over the years. He has attended all but 3 Masters Championships and for 10 plus years, he was the sole source of sending out the hundreds of qualification notices for each Championship contest. This was not any easy task as many of the 23 regional Contest Directors would forget to send in their results. In one case, the CD mailed in a napkin with only the first names of the top 30% as if Bill would know how to send them their packet. Bill tirelessly spent hours hunting down the contact information so the winner would have

enough advance time to make plans to attend. His very good friend, Ole Van Jorgensen flew over from Denmark and was joined by Josie and Earl Aune to help us surprise Bill with this honor.

Mitch now has the Judge application on the web site and is planning to add the Color Blind test shortly as well. If you are interested in becoming a Certified Judge either as a Static or Flight judge, be sure to check the web site for directions on receiving and then submitting your test.
